

Agreement in Fukuoka REAP Board Meeting

REAP Board Meeting March 5th (Thursday) 14:40-15:30 (50 minutes)

Note for the record

1. At the beginning, Prof N Shinfuku and Prof Chay Hoon Tan greeted the participants²
2. All the Participants made a brief self- introduction
3. Old REAP members from China, Japan, Taiwan, Singapore, Thailand, Indonesia and Prof Sartorius attended.
4. Experts from Myanmar, Mongolia, Cambodia and Papua New Guinea were interested in REAP and attended the Board Meeting as observers.
Dr Afzal Javed attended and informed the strong wish of five centers in Pakistan to join the future survey of REAP. Bangladesh and Viet Nam , though not present, expressed the wish to participants in the future REAP survey.
5. The group reviewed the publication of REAP . The number of papers accepted based on the data from REAP survey is now more than 50, mostly at reviewed international journals. Prof Sartorius suggested to list of the names of authors in the publication list. Prof Mian yoon Chong kindly agreed to revise the whole list chronologically since the first publication in 1999.
6. Dr Shi-ku Lin and Ms Shu-yu Yang proposed the follow up survey of REAP anti-psychotics in 2016. (Proposal attached). All the participants agreed with the outline of the proposes survey in 2016:
 - 1) In addition to ten countries and areas participated in REAP-antidepressants survey in 2013 (China, Korea, Japan. Hong Kong, Taiwan, Singapore, India, Malaysia, Thailand and Indonesia), Bangladesh, Myanmar ,Pakistan, Vietnam will join in the REAP AP survey in 2016.
 - 2) It will be necessary to prepare the research protocol and questionnaire and finalize it by October 2015. Sample size, items of questionnaire should be decided.
 - 3) We will aim the survey during one month in March 2016.
7. Special activities will be considered for countries with the very limited resources to improve the prescription habits of psychotropic medicine. Cambodia, Mongolia and Papua New Guinea.
8. Taiwan colleagues have invited the Group to attend and organize activities at the WPA IC Taipei Nov 2015 hosted by WPA and Taiwanese Society of Psychiatry.
